I feel that I was lucky to have been at the South Street Seaport Museum that day, to have met Ed, and later to become a member of the VWOA.



It is estimated that there are over two billion cell telephones in use throughout the world, with additional coverage areas growing at an amazingly fast rate. A number of communications industary analysts have predicted that in the next several years the majority of our telephone calls will be made over a technique known as Voice over Internet protocol (VoIp). This means that the data capacity of the Internet will have to be increased many times over what it is at present to be capable of handling this huge volume of traffic.

THE 2006 MARCONI MEMORIAL AWARD JOHN HAINES DILKS III



At age seven, John Dilks developed an interest in ham radio by listening to short-wave on his grandfather's all-band radio.

At age twelve, his father brought home a National ham radio receiver for the summer. He and a friend listened to hams and dreamed of getting a license. They tried unsuccessfully to learn the Morse code.

After joining the radio club in his high school, he receive a Novice license, dated July 5, 1956, and went on the air with a single 6V6 oscillator running about five-watts. He continues to hold the amateur radio call K2TQN.

His interest in electronics led to a 38-year technology career with Western Electric, AT&T, and finally Lucent Technologies. Retiring in 2001 he followed a life-long dream and is now working in education at his local Middle School.


Always interested in radio history and old radios, he started collecting radios and historical information in the 1990s. He built a mobile ham radio museum and through that was able to introduce many new hams ham radio history.

The American Radio Relay League asked him to write a vintage radio column in *QST Magazine* starting January 2000. So far he has written almost 80 articles in his "Old Radio" column.


South Street Seaport Museum
